About the Keynote Speaker: Fredrika Newton

Fredrika Newton is the co-founder of the Dr. Huey P. Newton Foundation and the Black Panther Party Museum in Oakland. A former rank and file member of the Black Panther Party, Fredrika is also the widow of its co-founder Dr. Huey P. Newton. For 30 years, the Foundation has worked to preserve and promote the accurate legacy and ideals of the Black Panther Party.

Under her leadership, the foundation commissions public art and creates educational tools to produce real social, economic and political change. In 2024, she co-founded The Black Panther Party Museum in downtown Oakland, featuring a variety of exhibitions designed to educate the public about the Party. Its newest exhibition, Survival Pending Revolution, opened on February 13th of 2025.



About the Emcee: Matais D. Pouncil, Ed. D.

Dr. Matais D. Pouncil is the Vice President of Academic Affairs at Evergreen Valley College in San José, California. With nearly 25 years of experience in higher education across the California Community Colleges, California State University, and University of California systems, he has served in numerous leadership roles including Dean of Student Services, Associate Dean of Financial Aid Services and Student Success, and Interim Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs. He has also taught graduate students at the University of California and served as full-time faculty at a California State University.

Dr. Pouncil earned his B.S. in Economics from Southern University in Baton Rouge, an M.Ed. in Social and Multicultural Foundations from California State University, Long Beach, and became the first African American man to earn an Ed.D. from the University of California, Irvine. He also completed the Management Development Program at Harvard University's Graduate School of Education.



In addition to his academic leadership, Dr. Pouncil is deeply committed to civic and cultural engagement. He is a proud member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., serves on the board of the historic Cameron-Stanford House, and is a former board member of both the 100 Black Men of the Bay Area and the African American Shakespeare Company. He is also active with the Lake Merritt Breakfast Club, a supporter of the GRIP Training Institute, and a passionate patron of the arts.

An avid traveler, Dr. Pouncil has explored 42 U.S. states and four continents, enriching his global perspective and deepening his commitment to education, equity, and cultural understanding.
